

THE ASSOCIATION OF BLACK PSYCHOLOGISTS 2017 SAGE PUBLICATIONS STUDENT RESEARCH AWARD

The Association of Black Psychologists (ABPsi) encourages outstanding scholarship related to persons of African descent. Accordingly, ABPsi will recognize outstanding research conducted by a student during the 49th Annual International Convention in Houston, TX. An independent committee will evaluate all submissions and select one student to receive \$750 for the most outstanding student award. SAGE has also agreed to cover the travel expenses for the student to attend and possibly present at the convention. The award will be presented at the convention sometime between July 19 and July 23, 2017.

Evaluation criteria will include:

- Relevance of the research to the psychological experience of African-descent populations;
- Soundness of the submission's theoretical/conceptual framework and methodology;
- Potential of the research to inform and improve policy-making;
- Extent to which the research represents an innovative perspective; and
- Likelihood of being published.

Students submitting papers must be the first author but can have co-authors. Multiple submissions are not allowed. Guidelines for authors outlined in the Journal of Black Psychology should be used in preparing unpublished manuscripts. Manuscripts (including tables, figures, and references) cannot exceed 35 double-spaced pages. Only electronic submissions will be considered. Both unpublished manuscripts and manuscripts published in the past 12 months are eligible. Published manuscripts are not required to conform to the guidelines of the Journal of Black Psychology.

DEADLINE: All submissions must be received by May 15, 2017.
