## Mission

As Sisters of the Academy, our mission is to create an educational network of Black women in higher education committed to fostering collaborative scholarship and achievement. Through this commitment, members of the organization will impact Black people, schools, and communities.

## Research BootCamp® Purpose

1. To create a forum for senior scholars, junior scholars, administrators, and doctoral students to advance their research skills.
2. To connect participants with mentors and colleagues who will assist them in their development as scholars in the academy.

## Research BootCamp® Overview

The Research BootCamp® is an intense, one-week program designed to assist doctoral students, administrators, and junior faculty members in developing the skills necessary for success in the academy. Senior scholars, statisticians, and theorists will facilitate workshops intended to help doctoral students conceptualize and design key components of their dissertations including:

- Research Question and Hypothesis Development
- Literature Review
- Conceptual Framework Development
- Instrumentation
- Methodology
- Data Analysis

Senior scholars will also assist administrators and junior scholars in the development of manuscripts for publication, and clarification of a future research agenda. In addition to the research component, each participant will be linked with a senior scholar to help cultivate a mentoring relationship.

The 2013 Research BootCamp® will be held July 28-August 3 in Tallahassee, FL at Florida State University.

## Knowledge, Skills, & Values

SOTA's mission is rooted in a tripartite foundation of knowledge, skills, and values that inform the programmatic activities of the organization. SOTA seeks to support our members in developing a knowledge and skill base that will equip them to become competent teachers, scholars, and servants. We also seek to support members as they identify, clarify, develop, and maintain their core values. These values are necessary to become centered and competent teachers, scholars, and mentors.

**Skills Development** - We are intentional in creating opportunities for the acquisition of skills related to:

- Developing research questions
- Critical thinking
- Data collection
- Data analysis
- Academic writing
- Publishing

**Values** - We are intentional in creating opportunities for the clarification of values related to: (1) Professional development, (2) Community outreach, and (3) Personal development.

## Logistics

Research BootCamp® activities will take place on the Florida State University campus located in Tallahassee, FL. Participants have two options for housing.

1. A room block will be available at a local hotel in Tallahassee. More details will be announced.
2. On-Campus: BootCamp® participants will be housed in apartment-style on-campus housing at Ragans Hall. Each apartment can accommodate up to 4 individuals. Each unit contains a full-size kitchen, living room, 4 single bedrooms, and 2 shared bathrooms. Each bedroom is accessible only to the person assigned, while all suite mates will have access to the common areas. As this housing option is closest to traditional residence hall living, additional personal items may be required to provide the comforts of home. If participants choose this housing option, SOTA will make apartment assignments. If you know another participant and would like to be placed with her, please indicate this on your application. ## Application Process

The Research BootCamp<sup>®</sup> has been designed for individuals in the Social Science and STEM disciplines. There are three levels of participation and a specific application process for each level. A \$100 refundable application fee must accompany your application.

***Junior Faculty & Administrators.*** All pre-tenure Social Science, STEM faculty, as well as higher education administrators in the academy. Junior Faculty & Administrators should submit the following items with their BootCamp<sup>®</sup> application:

1. Curriculum Vita
2. Letter of support from department chair, departmental mentor, or supervisor
3. Personal Statement addressing the following: *(Please limit to 3 pages)*
  - Describe your research agenda and your advancement with this agenda.
  - What specific outcomes do you expect to achieve during the BootCamp<sup>®</sup>?
  - What progress do you hope to have made by the time the BootCamp<sup>®</sup> begins?
  - What are the expectations at your institution for promotion/advancement and/or tenure?
  - Given your experiences at your institution, what challenges have you faced in meeting these expectations?

## Application Process

***Level Two - Doctoral Student:*** A doctoral student in the Social Sciences who has successfully defended the research proposal and is in the research/data collection stage. Doctoral students interested in attending the Research BootCamp® should submit the following materials with their application:

1. **Curriculum Vitae or Resume**
2. **Abstract of your research goals**
3. **Methodology section of your research proposal or dissertation**
4. **Letter of support from faculty advisor addressing:** (1) student's strengths and weaknesses as a researcher and (2) skills you would like student develop as they pertain to conducting research
5. **Personal Statement addressing the following:** *(Please limit to 3 pages)*
  - Describe your research interests and any research experiences you have participated in during your program.
  - What research skills would you like to develop (i.e. statistical analysis, survey design, data management)?
  - What specific outcomes do you expect to achieve during the BootCamp®?

***Level One - Doctoral Student:*** A doctoral student in the Social Sciences who is preparing the research or dissertation proposal. Doctoral students interested in attending the Research BootCamp® should submit the following materials with their application:

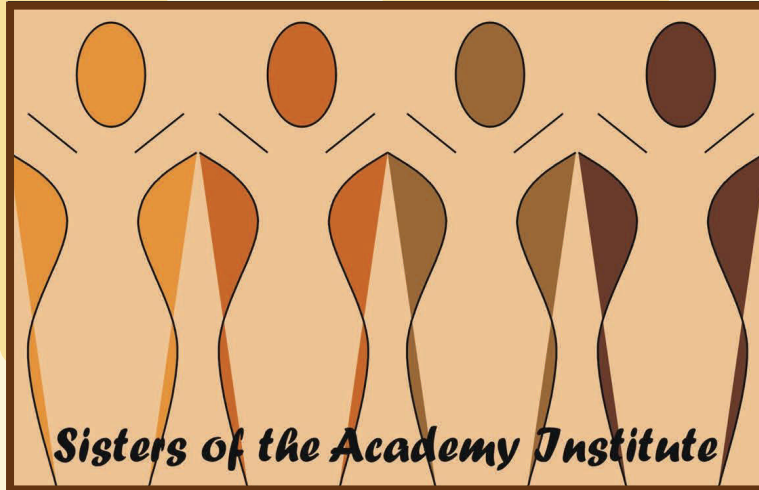
