We also mourn the loss of Congressman Louis Stokes, one of the most brilliant and greatest statesmen in the history of this country. His commitment and dedication to uplifting African people was evident in the Keynote Address he provided at the 37th Annual International Convention of the Association of Black Psychologist (ABPsi) held in Cleveland, Ohio in 2005.

Congressman Louis Stokes was the first black congressman elected in the state of Ohio, and in 1968 he became the first African American Congressman elected from a major city in the United States of America. He also served 15 terms in the United States House of Representatives. His impact on the well-being of the people of district and U.S. has been long lasting.

A courageous, smart, committed political leader with great acumen for addressing the needs of persons of African ancestry, Congressman Louis Stokes will long be remembered for all that he has done to serve and uphold his people.
